

Fenton High School 2010-2011 Important Registration Information

The school will be open for registration daily from August 9th through August 13th. Students must complete their registration and pay their fees according to the following schedule:

- August 9: 8:00 am to 3:00 pm for Juniors and Seniors whose last names begin with A-K
- August 10: 8:00 am to 3:00 pm for Juniors and Seniors whose last names begin with L-Z
- August 11: 11:00 am to 6:00 pm for all Freshmen
- August 12: 8:00 am to 3:00 pm for all Sophomores
- August 13: 8:00 am to 3:00 pm for Late Registration *(for students unable to register on their designated day)*

*All freshmen and all other students who did not have their photo taken for their identification cards, **must register in person**. Students are required to carry their ID cards with them at all times in school and at school activities. Information on registration fees can be found on page two of this newsletter.

Proof of Residency Documentation

Proof of Residency at fall student registration will be required on an individual basis. All new or transferred students will be required to prove residency. The district reserves the right to require proof of residency of any individual family. All students registering should prepare to prove residency at registration to expedite the registration process. Families should be able to provide at least three of the following documents in order to establish residency in the Wood Dale or Bensenville communities:

AAP Launches New Web Site for Parents, HealthyChildren.org

In a sea of conflicting and confusing health information, parents have always turned to their family pediatrician as a trusted source of advice. Now, in a virtual extension of the pediatrician's office, the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) is bringing pediatrician-approved health information to the Internet with the launch of healthychildren.org.

The only Web site backed by 60,000 pediatricians, guidance for parents and caregivers, along with interactive tools and personalized content.

Parents can learn about seasonal health issues or read about the latest scientific research and AAP policies. By registering with the site, parents can customize the information based on their children's ages and health topics. The "Ask the Pediatrician" tool allows parents to browse a list of frequently asked questions, or pose their own questions. And a pediatrician finder makes it easy for both first-time and experienced parents to find an AAP-member pediatrician in their area.

Most importantly, all content is developed and reviewed by leading child health experts and reflects the latest scientific research. Whether they're seeking general information about children's health, or specific answers to a pediatric issue, parents can be confident in the information they find on healthychildren.org.

Fenton Community High School District 100 Pest Control Notification

The Illinois legislature passed amendments to the Structural Pest Control Act and the Illinois Pesticide Act that affect how pests, mice, ants, etc., are controlled in schools. The legislation affects the schools in basically two ways. 1) All Illinois schools are required to adopt a pest control process called Integrated Pest Management or IPM, and 2) Schools are required to notify staff, students, and parents prior to certain types of pest control applications.

Integrated Pest Management places emphasis on inspection and communication with the school administration. The focus of the program is to identify and eliminate conditions in the school which could cause pests to be a problem. Applications of pest control materials are made only when necessary to eliminate a pest problem. Regular spraying is not a part of the program.

If it becomes necessary to use any pest control products other than traps or baits, notice will be posted two business days prior to the application. The *only* exception to the two day notice would be if there is an immediate threat to health or property. If you would like to receive written notification prior to the application of any pest control materials subject to the notification requirements, please contact Blake Brodie, Director of Buildings and Grounds at 630-860-6275. The school district has contracted with Big Foot to provide Integrated Pest Management services. If you have any questions about the information and procedures, you may contact Big Foot at 310 E. Changes to the Free and Reduced Lunch Program 2010-2011

Several changes have been made to the free and reduced lunch program application process. Free and reduced lunch applications will be mailed with registration materials during mid July. Completed applications are due back to Fenton by Wednesday, July 28. All applications will be reviewed the week of August 2. Any student qualifying for **free** lunch will receive a waiver of any REQUIRED fees. Any student approved for **reduced lunch will not** receive a waiver of fees. Advisory Continues in 4th Year of Program

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Fenton Advisory Period is to build a sense of community, to enhance learning and to establish positive social relationships by providing opportunities for students and staff to make meaningful connections and collaborate in a supportive environment.

The Advisory Program is a program for ALL students at Fenton. Students belong to grade level advisory groups with one or two advisors. Certified staff members serve as the advisors and remain with the same group of students until the students graduate.

Advisory groups will meet twice a month on Thursdays. On Advisory Thursdays, classes are shortened by 5 minutes to allow for the 24 minute Advisory period to happen during the normal school day.

Students will participate in activities that address Illinois Social and Emotional Learning Standards. Some activities that students will participate in this year involve academic skills, preparing for life after high school, communication skills, and social skills like diversity appreciation and appropriate behavior.

GERMANY June 2011-2012

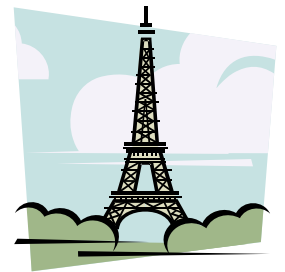
